



## Durable eucalypt forestry field day

## Friday 26th Feb 2016, 12.00 – 4.30 pm

## At TECT All Terrain Park, Pyes Pa Road SH 36, Bay of Plenty

The New Zealand Dryland Forests Initiative (NZDFI) is a commercially-oriented research and development project to develop genetically improved planting stock and management systems for ground-durable eucalypt species suited to New Zealand's dryland regions. This includes highly innovative research into heartwood development and timber durability.

The NZDFI is working with farm foresters to develop best-practice pruning and thinning regimes so that growers can produce a range of products including posts and poles.

This field day is to view eucalypt trials planted in 2011 at Tect Park. These are part of an extensive trial series established by NZDFI throughout NZ's east coast to evaluate the potential adaptability, productivity and management of durable eucalypts. The establishment of these trials was supported by the Ministry of Primary Industries Sustainable Farming Fund.
