Ground-durable eucalypts: a potential **forestry opportunity**for the Taupo District

FIELD TRIP AND EVENING SEMINAR

OVERVIEW:

The NZ Dryland Forests Initiative's vision is that New Zealand will become home to a valuable sustainable hardwood industry based on ground-durable eucalypt forests by 2050. To achieve this, the NZDFI is developing a complementary high-value land-use for warmer parts of eastern New Zealand where rainfall is low and unreliable.

While Taupo District is in central North Island, a new durable eucalypt trial was planted in 2014 in collaboration with Lake Taupo Forest Trust with support from MPI's Sustainable Farming Fund. This trial was established within the central part of Lake Taupo Forest behind Mission Bay. It was planted to test the potential adaptability of a number of durable eucalypt species to higher rainfall; cooler inland conditions and pumice soils; also to demonstrate whether eucalypts can be successfully established and managed following a harvest of radiata pine.

We will make an afternoon field trip to this trial and then return to Taupo for a light dinner followed by an evening seminar. Timely and correct form-pruning is a key part to management of these trials and this will be a focus of the field trip, which will be led by NZDFI project manager Paul Millen.

The NZ Dryland Forests Initiative (NZDFI) is a commercially-oriented research and development project. It aims to develop genetically improved planting stock and management systems for ground-durable eucalypt species suited to New Zealand's dryland regions. The NZDFI is researching the genetic potential of selected eucalypts that includes highly innovative research into heartwood development and timber durability.

The NZDFI is also developing forest management systems for growers, and planning to access national and international markets with its timbers.

In July 2015, the NZDFI became a partner to the new Specialty Wood products research programme being led by Future Forests Research.
